

Official Lists Criteria For Peace Corps

A veteran of the Peace Corps "since the beginning," is in Eugene meeting with interested students at the University of Oregon.

Timmy Napolitano, whose official title is project officer for the Near East and South Asia division of the peace corps, explained the criteria for peace corps volunteers Tuesday.

"First," she said, "the volunteer must have a sense of humor. If you don't have, you won't survive. Life gets tough and the emotions get high and you must be able to laugh at yourself."

"Also," Mrs. Napolitano said, "the volunteer should have a strong eagerness and willingness to serve. . . they should think it is worth doing. I don't mean they should be martyrs, but they should have a curious mind and a desire to understand themselves as well as the culture of the country they are in."

"The volunteer should be a sensitive human being. We can teach them the mores and the culture . . . such as not to eat meat in India where the natives can see you. But they have to be sensitive enough to understand other people's feelings."

"There are two sides of the coin on the question of skill. First is the formal, such as engineer, teacher, or electrician and the second is the informal. This simply means getting the people in the community to help themselves by working with them and by example."

"A language aptitude is a nice thing to have, but it is not a necessity. It is a bonus. The peace corps will teach the language but the volunteer should have a desire to learn."

There are currently 44 countries asking for volunteers, according to Mrs. Napolitano, and over 4,000 prospective volunteers are scheduled to begin training soon.

"The peace corps is fundamentally an education job," she said, "we teach people to help themselves."

Heceta Light To Be Automated

FLORENCE, Ore. (AP) — Automation is about to put another Oregon lighthouse keeper out of business.

The Coast Guard has announced that the Heceta Head Lighthouse, 12 miles north of Florence, will be made automatic about July 20.

Keeper Oswald Allik, with more than 30 years in lighthouse and coast guard service, will retire.

Heceta Head Lighthouse was built in 1894.

During the past 1½ years the Coast Guard has automated the North Head and Cape Mearns lighthouses. North Head is near the mouth of the Columbia River. Mearns is just west of Tillamook.
