At Linfield's Portland Campus, students major in nursing and health sciences. Residence hall, classrooms, labs, and library are located in NW Portland next to Legacy Good Samaritan Medical Center. Many students also commute from the metro Portland area and southwestern Washington.

The Adult Degree Program offers bachelor's degrees in eight majors; accounting, arts & humanities, busi-



ness information systems, international business, management, nursing (RN to BSN), social & behavioral sciences, and marketing, with courses delivered primarily online.

Internet access and a web browser are all that a student needs to have their own personal classroom. Adult Degree Program students are eligible to begin at Linfield with any number of previous college credits.

Adult Degree Program also offers classes on the Portland campus one evening per week, and through hybrid classes that blend face-to-face meetings twice a month with online communication.

Linfield offers four professional certificate programs; Human Resource Management, Marketing, Computer Information Systems and the Post Baccalaureate Accounting Certificate.

Financial Aid is offered to all Linfield College students. The majority of the students take advantage of some form of scholarship or financial aid to help finance their education.
