PDX Citizen Noise Advisory Committee Meets Sept. 8

The Portland International Airport Citizen Noise Advisory Committee will meet from 6-8 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 8 in the Anchor Conference Room on the first floor of the Port of Portland headquarters at 7200 NE Airport Way. The community is encouraged to attend, and public comment is welcome.

Meeting topics will include a discussion of the noise management best practices survey, reviewing noise programs around the U.S., and comparing them to PDX. The full meeting agenda is available at www.portofportland.com/cnac_agenda.aspx.

The committee is the Port's official forum for working with the community on issues related to aircraft noise. Committee representatives are from northwest Oregon and southwest Washington. Eleven members are appointed by various city and county jurisdictions, and four representatives are appointed by the Port in an effort to maintain geographic diversity on the committee. Technical assistance is provided by the Federal Aviation Administration and the Oregon Air National Guard.
