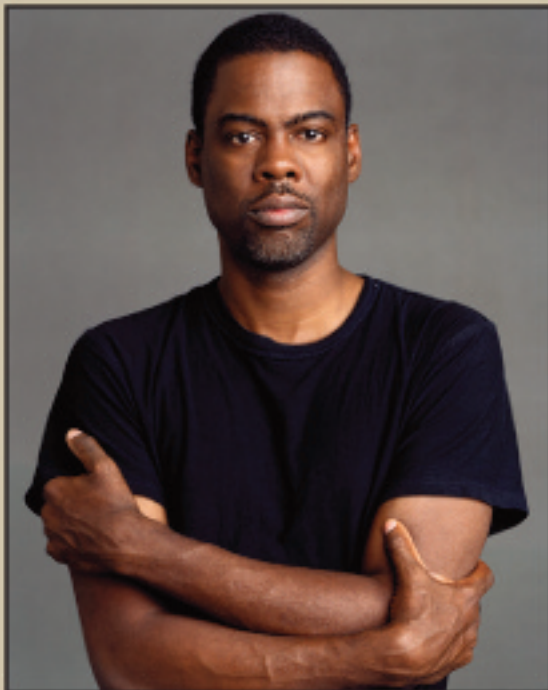

THE BLACK LIST

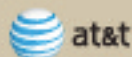
