North Portland Training Center teaches the art of recording oral history

A free intensive workshop on Saturday, September 29 from 9 A.M. – 5 P.M. is open to the general public 18 years and over. Sponsored by The Skanner Foundation, the North Portland Multimedia Training Center (NPMTTC) offers training and production opportunities to increase visibility of the community in a positive way.

In addition, skills learned through the project's multimedia workshops have led to successful careers in production for some students.

This new workshop blends teaching the mechanics of HD camera operation and the art of producing oral history in a one-day 8-hour workshop.

NPMTTC supports the community's effort to record the histories of its citizens through their own words. The first topic used for the project-based training will be "Life in Vanport." This is an outreach to the com-

munity to capture any remaining stories about a lost city, once an important part of Portland, before it is too late.

The upcoming NPMTTC workshop is taught by Tim Rooney and Miae Kim, experts in videography and oral history documentation. The NPMTTC workshop takes place at The Skanner, 415 N. Killingsworth, Portland.
