Drowning is the second leading cause of unintentional injury death among children ages 1 – 14 years old.

The cost for life jackets sizes infant to youth large is \$20, and for teens to adult size XXXL, is \$30. The life jackets are comfortable, high-quality vests in fashion colors. All sales are final -sorry, Parks cannot offer refunds or returns.

Parks will hold additional life jacket sales from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. on Saturday, July 19, and Saturday, Aug. 16.

Parks offers this program in partnership with Seattle Children’s Hospital, Mustang Survival, and the Coast Guard Auxiliary.
