Seahawks and Boeing Give Game Tickets to Impact Local Youth

Legion of Youth, a new program launched by Boeing at the Seattle Seahawks, will award Seahawks game tickets to community organizations that serve youth throughout the Northwest. Each regular season home game, 100 game tickets will be given to a group or organization.

In addition, the program will recognize students who are committed to their school work, demonstrate leadership, and are active in the community.

During each of the eight regular season games, 25 youth will each receive four game tickets, breakfast with a special message from a Seahawks alum, concession vouchers, and a Legion of Youth Powered by Boeing sweatshirt.

The Seahawks and Boeing will select the community groups to receive the tickets each game. All community organizations will be notified by a member from the Seahawks staff. Recipients will be announced on www.seahawks.com each Wednesday prior to a home game.

Aug. 28 Deadline to File for Safe Deposit Contents before Auction

Did you recently receive a letter from the Washington State Department of Revenue about unclaimed safe deposit box contents that could be yours? If so, the deadline to claim the items is Thursday.

Revenue sent letters to around 700 people in late July letting them know the agency has been holding for several years safe deposit box contents in their name. The letters advise the recipients that the contents will be auctioned off this fall unless they file a claim by Aug. 28, 2014.

Revenue is working with the James G. Murphy Company on a two-day auction slated for Nov. 19 and 20, 2014 in Kenmore, Wash.

Seahawks Announce Route for NFL Kickoff Run on Sept. 1

The Seattle Seahawks and the NFL announced today the route for the 2014 NFL KICKOFF RUN, set for Monday, September 1.

The course begins outside CenturyLink Field on Occidental Avenue South with runners travelling south on 1st Avenue until South Hanford Street. The course U-turns with runners travelling north on 1st Avenue until South Massachusetts Street where the course transitions to a route on the service road behind Safeco Field, adjacent to the railroad tracks. The course concludes with fans entering CenturyLink Field and running through the tunnel onto the field.

All race participants will receive a commemorative finisher medal and Seahawks race t-shirt. Registration fees are \$50 for adults and \$20 for youth, ages 4-12, through August 24.
