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announcing the appeal. “I believe that public trust in policing in Portland depends on all Council members demonstrating that we are committed to implementing the Agreement fully. I accept that responsibility.”

Meanwhile, the city is in the process of hiring a Compliance Officer/Community Liaison to monitor progress of the agreement.

Three finalists have been interviewed and the city has asked the public to comment on the hire. However,

the Mental Health Association of Portland has called for a new recruitment effort saying the city failed to advertise the quarter of a million a year position widely enough.

Just 12 resumes were submitted for the position. Beck-

ie Childs, an adjunct professor at Portland State University and member of the Mental Health Association, who sat on an advisory panel, says none of the candidates is qualified for the role.
