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Family of Victim Asks for Public's Help

The family of a Seattle man murdered in Portland, D'Andre Dickerson, is asking the public's help to find out how and why he was killed. Wednesday, May 6, from

Dickerson's last known address is in Seattle, Washington and it is not known why he was in Portland or where he may have been staying locally.

Crime Stoppers of Oregon is offering a reward of up to \$1,000 cash for information given to Crime Stoppers that leads to an arrest in this case. Tipsters can remain anonymous.

The investigation started on Tuesday April 14, 2015, at 12:18 a.m., when North Precinct officers responded to multiple reports of gunshots heard in the area Northeast Dekum Street and Claremont Avenue.

Arriving officers began checking the area, including Woodlawn Park, when a caller reported a person down in a residential parking lot in the 6800 block of Northeast Claremont Avenue.

Officers and medical personnel arrived and located Dickerson, who was deceased after being shot multiple times.

Information learned from social media sites such as Facebook, Twitter or YouTube should be shared
