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NAACP to Hold Memorial for Elbert Williams In Tennessee

This Saturday the Brownsville, Tennessee community will gather for the delayed memorial of Civil Rights Pioneer Elbert Williams at Haywood High School. Williams is the first known National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) official to be killed for his involvement in the local civil rights movement. For all media outlets planning to cover the Elbert Williams memorial service please provide the names of the reporters, photographers and videographers who will be in attendance by 12 p.m. Friday. Media may arrive as early as 8 a.m. to meet in the library of Haywood High School, where they will be asked to sign in to receive a press kit. Light refreshments will be provided. The memorial service will begin promptly at 9 a.m. in the gymnasium and will feature NAACP National President Cornell William Brooks as the guest speaker. At 11 a.m., a state historical marker will be unveiled in downtown Brownsville.

Following the unveiling, members of the Elbert Williams Memorial Committee will be available for media interviews at the Brownsville Chamber of Commerce, 121 W. Main Street, on the first floor level. A brief service will be held at 1 p.m. at Taylor Cemetery, where Williams is buried. Organizers have planned a somber march to the burial site. Reporters and photographers planning to stay for the cemetery service should prepare to walk. In case of inclement weather, the burial site service will be cancelled. Should any reporters need to complete their interviews following the cemetery service, they may return to the Brownsville Chamber of Commerce where committee members will be available.
