Non-Profits Begin Work on the Former Sugar Shack

After many months of planning and fundraising, the community coalition Living Cully has purchased the property to a strip club that many in the neighborhood had complained about for years.

Now with the 25,991-square-foot building in new hands, the community looks forward to re-envisioning it for the Cully neighborhood, a Northeast Portland area that has undergone swift changes in the last decade but remains one of the city’s most diverse.

The purchase came at the cost of \$2.3 million — all paid to the order of its former owners, who currently face a host of charges for allegedly running a prostitution ring out of the club, called the Sugar Shack, and hiding more than \$5 million in profit from the Internal Revenue Service.

In May the building’s owners, Kandace Desmarais and her brother Gilbert, pleaded guilty to conspiring to promote prostitution and defraud the IRS. They await a sentencing hearing set for Sept. 9.

Living Cully organizer Tony Delfalco says many ideas have been proposed for the space, which include transforming it to a business incubator, charter school or a retail space.

“The challenge that we face is bringing in the kinds of the community needs but having the money to do that,” DeFalco says, noting that part of how Living Cully was able to purchase the property was through a Portland Development Commission loan.

Referencing ongoing development in inner North and Northeast Portland, DeFalco says the organization is making it central to its mission that what becomes of the building stabilizes Cully’s current population.

“We are looking for anti-displacement uses for the property, by that I mean uses that serve the community that’s there now versus some community to come into this

neighborhood later.” According to DeFalco, one of the competitors they beat out for purchasing the property was someone interested in continuing to utilize the building as a strip club.

Over the last decade, the building, situated at 67th Avenue and Killingsworth Streets, has played host to adult-oriented businesses.

Representatives from the four non-profits that compose Living Cully began cleaning the club Wednesday morning.

Crews worked for more than six hours at the Street location, which still bears heavy remnants of its past functionality for adult entertainment.

On Aug. 4, Living Cully will host another session officially celebrating the purchase of the property.
