November 4, 1984, Bud Clark is elected mayor of Portland, defeating Frank Ivancie

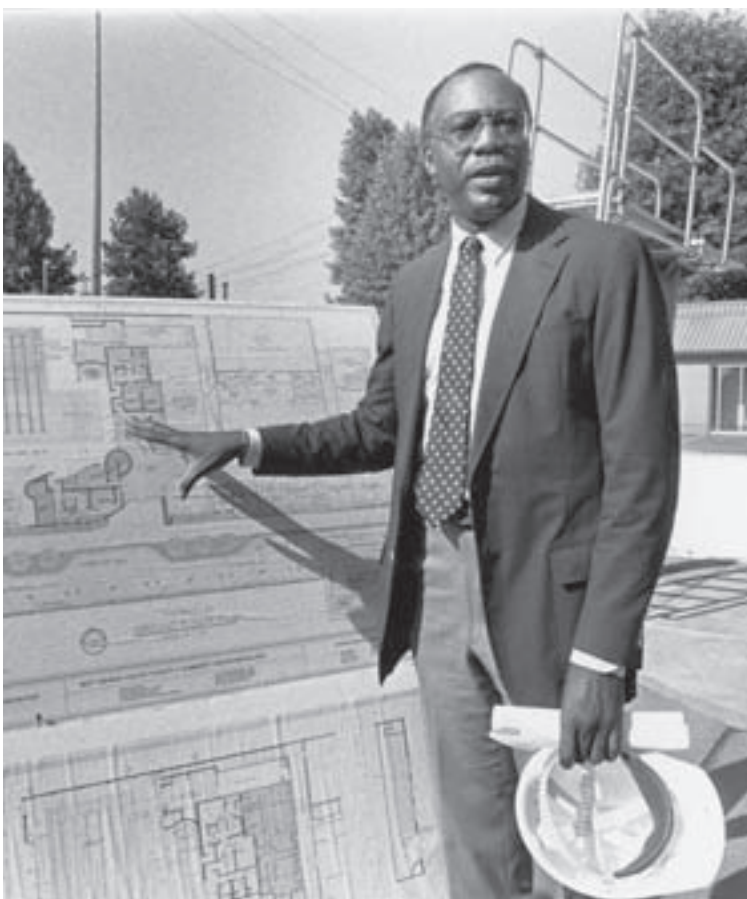
January 1, 1985, Dick Bogle begins first term as Portland City Commissioner

January 1, 1985, Margaret Carter becomes first Black female legislator in Oregon history

April 20, 1985, Lloyd "Tony" Stevenson, a 31-year-old security guard is choked to death by Portland Police Officer Gary Barbour at the 7-Eleven at Northeast 3rd Avenue and Weidler Street. On the day of his funeral, Police officers Paul Wickersham and Richard Montee distribute t-shirts that read, "Smoke 'em, don't choke 'em."
