

A Look Back At 2016

Trump Elected

Donald Trump claimed his place Nov. 8 as America's 45th president, an astonishing victory for the celebrity businessman and political novice who capitalized on voters' economic anxieties, took advantage of racial tensions and overcame a string of sexual assault allegations on his way to the White House. By the time of the Dec. 19 electoral college vote, Democratic challenger Hillary Clinton was up by 3 million votes in the popular vote – but Trump nevertheless clinched a narrow electoral victory. While national results failed to place a woman in the White House, female politicians in Oregon claimed several notable victories, including the election of Gov. Kate Brown, the re-elections of attorney general Ellen Rosenblum and Congresswoman Suzanne Bonamici and the surprising victory of city council candidate Chloe Eudaly over incumbent Steve Novick. The Multnomah County Commission also ended the night with the election of a majority-female, majority-minority board of commissioners for the first time in the county's history.

Raiford Tried, Acquitted

Teresa Raiford, a lead organizer with Don't Shoot PDX, was tried and acquitted in April in connection with an arrest held during a protest the previous August. On Aug. 9, 2015 – the one-year anniversary of the shooting of Mike Brown by police in Ferguson, Mo., police – a group of 100 protestors stopped traffic at 82nd Avenue and SE Division Street for four and a half minutes to remember the four and a half hours that Brown's body lay in the street after he was shot. The group then moved to the southwest corner of the intersection where they began chanting and drumming, Raiford said. A video shows most of the protestors had moved onto the sidewalk, but Raiford was in the street when she was arrested on a charge of second-degree disorderly conduct. Another protestor, Diane Chavez, was also arrested for second-degree disorderly conduct.

Standing Rock Solidarity

Three year old Enick and her father joined hundreds of people in a march from City Hall to Westlake Park in Seattle Sept. 17 to show solidarity with the Standing Rock Sioux as they fight to stop the building of the Dakota Access Pipeline. On Dec. 4, the Obama administration denied the final permit for the pipeline and said a different route would be sought, granting activists a temporary victory. Protesters across the country continue to urge divestment from banks funding the pipeline, and activists anticipate a lengthy legal battle to ensure the pipeline is not constructed.

Resisting Trump

Garfield High School students left class and joined 5,000 other Seattle students from 20 public schools in a walkout Nov. 14 to protest the election of Donald Trump. Students chanted "Not My President" and "We Reject the President Elect" and they carried signs that said things like "America was Never Great for P.O.C" and "Love Trumps Hate." Portland Public Schools students numbering in the hundreds walked out the same day, and the week following Trump's election saw several consecutive nights of protest in cities nationwide, with Portland protesters numbering in the thousands.
