work, rather than refugees, and Israel had a right to dictate its immigration policy.

“Israel cannot be the unemployment office of Africa,” she told Israel’s Army Radio on Tuesday. “They are not being sent to their death, they are going to work somewhere else.”

The Africans’ advocates say this is not so. They say Rwanda has not absorbed them, with most moving on to Uganda and then elsewhere in Africa.

Nearly all hail from Eritrea, where men are often forced into a military service with slavery-like conditions, and Sudan, which was torn by a 22-year-civil war and a genocide in its Western region of Darfur.

Unable to return to their home countries, the activists say the migrants have been pushed into a second refugee ordeal, where many have been tortured, extorted and raped in Libya or drowned trying to make it to Europe. In one well-known case, an Eritrean Christian who had left Israel was beheaded on a Libyan beach by the Islamic State group in 2015.

Israel’s Interior Ministry, which oversees policy toward the migrants, declined comment. But at a recent parliamentary debate, Interior Minister Ariele Deri, an ultra-Orthodox Jew, said it was “Jewish morality to deport the infiltrators.”

Such rhetoric has outraged some of Israel’s greatest supporters. The Anti-Defamation League and the Reform Movement are among the leading Jewish American groups to express concerns over the pending deportations in recent weeks.

Joey Low, a New York-based philanthropist

who has donated millions of dollars to Israeli causes, said the country must freeze its deportation plans and establish a thorough mechanism to evaluate each individual asylum seeker. Should it not, he said he would be so ashamed he didn’t think he’d be able to invest or even visit Israel again.

“If they do it, it will forever be a blemish on our history,” said Low, himself a son of a refugee from Nazi Germany. “It’s an attack on our core values. It’s what makes Israel special and what makes Jews special.”

sue holistically and see that tens of thousands of DACA enrollees are Black and that the plurality of diversity visa recipients are also Black, it contextualizes the president’s assault on these programs.

Unfortunately, these assaults on our criminal justice system, our consumer protections, our education and our health, will continue through 2018.

What Trump’s first year showed is that hard-earned progress will never be safe so long as his bigotry, hatred and racism hold power. But

what we showed this year in Alabama and Virginia, to not just our community, but to our country and the rest of the world, is that even in the face of opposition, our activism will continue and will prevail. We must be organized and we will be organized. This year, Trump has answered his own question about what Black Americans have to lose. But it’s an answer we don’t plan to accept.

Lease Crutcher Lewis, LLC, serving as the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CM/GC) for the University of Oregon is soliciting **proposals from qualified Mechanical/Plumbing, Electrical and Laboratory Subcontractors** for the preconstruction services and construction of the UO Klamath 4th Floor Renovation in Eugene, Oregon. Terms and conditions of the proposal are outlined in the Lease Crutcher Lewis, LLC (CM/GC) “Request for Proposal”, dated January 29, 2018, attached to and made a part of the Contract Documents.

Proposals will be received at the offices of Lease Crutcher Lewis, LLC, (CM/GC), 600 SW 12th Avenue, Portland, Oregon 97205, until 1:00PM PST, February 12, 2018 at which time the proposals will be privately opened. Proposals shall be clearly marked “UO Klamath Hall”

The total building construction cost is projected to be approximately \$16 million.

The project consists of renovation of the existing 3rd floor of Klamath Hall (for reference this is the 4th level of the building) into laboratory intensive space, which will be built in 2 phases while keeping services to all adjacent spaces and floors. The total gross square footage is approximately 20,000 SF. The project site is located within the Science Complex of the University of Oregon Campus, along Franklin Blvd and Onyx Street in Eugene, OR.

Lewis intends to enter into a contract with the selected firms for work that will initially include Preconstruction Phase Services only, for the scope of work. There are provisions for adding Construction Phase Services through acceptance of a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) by contract amendment.

Lewis, in partnership with UO and TVA, will evaluate each Proposer’s capabilities with respect to the evaluation criteria outlined in the Lease Crutcher Lewis, LLC (CM/GC) “Request for Proposal”, dated January 29, 2018. At its sole discretion, Lewis may select two (2) or more finalists to be interviewed by a selection committee in order to more fully understand the finalists’ relative qualifications.

This RFP does not commit Lewis to enter into any agreement, to pay any expenses incurred in preparation of any response to this request, or to procure or contract for any supplies, goods or services. Lewis reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals not in compliance with the RFP or if it is in the public interest to do so.

A Non-Mandatory pre-bid conference for Mechanical/Plumbing, Electrical and Laboratory Subcontractors will be held at the Lease Crutcher Lewis office, 600 SW 12th Avenue, Portland, OR 97205, on February 6, 2018 at 1:00PM (PST).
