## **County's First Afrocentric Women's** Transition Home to Open in Gresham

Diane Wade House offers culturally specific counseling, education and employment services

ultnomah County's women's transiwelcome residents this April.

8,000-square-foot The Diane Wade House is lo-

cated in Gresham and designed to house 38 residents. Funded through a \$2 million grant from the first Afrocentric MacArthur Safety and Iustice Challenge and adtional home will ministered by Bridges to Change, the facility will offer culturally specific

and addiction services.

Abbey Stamp, executive director at the Local Public Safety Coordinating Council, worked with the MacArthur Foundation to identify the need for better support services for women of color who are navigating the justice system and specifically, who are on probation.

She points out that while African Americans comprise only six percent of counseling, education, em- the population in Multployment, mental health, nomah County, they rep-

resent about 20 percent of inmates in Multnomah County Jail.

"We want to be responsive to a community that has not thrived or been able to seek recovery in the current continuum of justice services," Stamp said, adding that while there are local Afrocentric transitional services for men in the area, no such options existed for Black women.

### **Proud Boy Arrested in Connection With June Assault**

#### Donovon Lyle Flippo, 23, was booked Tuesday in connection with a homophobic assault

A member of the right-wing Proud Boys group was arrested Tuesday after being indicted last month on assault charges.

The arrest came a day after Mayor Ted Wheeler complained that law enforcement was essentially ignoring violent protests in the city.

Protests occur often in Portland and police have at times struggled to contain violent clashes.

"In what city is it legal to engage in a street brawl?" Mayor Ted Wheeler

asked Monday at a news conference. The Oregonian/OregonLive reported that 23-year-old Donovon Lyle Flippo of Vancouver, Washington, B was booked Tuesday in connection

He faces charges of third-degree assault, a felony, and fourth-degree assault, a misdemeanor. It wasn't clear if he had an attorney.
