LIST OF PREMIUMS.

Class I.—Cattle.

No. 1.—Shorthorns.

Bulls.

Table listing premiums for Shorthorn bulls and cows, including categories like 'Bull 2 years old and upward' and 'Cow 3 years old and upward'.

No. 2.—Devons.

Bulls.

Table listing premiums for Devon bulls and cows, including categories like 'Bull, 3 years old and upward' and 'Cow, 3 years old and upward'.

No. 3.—Herefords.

Same premiums as No. 2.

No. 4.—Ayrshires.

Same premiums as No. 2.

No. 5.—Alderneys.

Same premiums as No. 2.

No. 6.—Holsteins.

Same premiums as No. 2.

Exhibitors in Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, must furnish satisfactory evidence of age and pedigree.

No. 7.—Graded.

Cows.

Table listing premiums for graded cows, including categories like 'Cow, 3 years old and upward' and 'Heifer, 1 year old'.

RULE.—Exhibitors competing for premiums for the best milk cow of any blood, shall furnish the superintendent a certified statement of the amounts, by the weight, of milk produced by the cow entered by them, during 10 days of the season preceding the exhibition, with a statement of age of the calf at the time the milk is weighed.

No. 8.—Working Oxen.

Table listing premiums for working oxen, including categories like 'Pair, 3 years old and upward' and 'Pair, 1 and 2 years old, trained by a boy'.

No. 9.—Fat Cattle.

Competitors for this department are required to file with the Secretary a statement of the age of the animal, time, manner, quality and cost of feeding, and all the expenses connected with the fattening. This rule is intended for information to the public, and not to influence the judges in their decision.

Table listing premiums for fat cattle, including categories like 'Bullocks of any age' and 'Working oxen competing in No. 8, Class I'.

No. 10.—Herds.

Table listing premiums for herds, including categories like 'Best display of a herd of cattle of any age or breed' and 'Best herd of cattle one bull and four heifers'.

The person taking the greatest number of first premiums in this Class to receive a gold medal; the second best, a silver medal.

NOTE.—No premium will be awarded unless the rules are strictly complied with.

Special Premiums.

SPECIAL PREMIUMS of \$75 for the first, and \$50 for the second, are offered to the largest and finest collection of not less than 5 head of cattle, for breeding purposes, brought from, and exhibited by any person residing east of the Cascade mountains; and a further special premium of \$65 for the first and \$40 for the second, to the person exhibiting the largest and finest collection of cattle for breeding purposes, not less than 5 head, owned and brought from south of the Cascade mountains; said cattle from both sections to be allowed to compete with each other, and for all cattle premiums offered by the Society.

Class II.—Horses.

No. 1.—Horses of all Work.

The "Horse of all Work" should be fifteen hands, quick, lively ears, broad between the eyes, round barrel, short loins, well up in the shoulder, deep in the chest, square quarters, flat legs, short between the knee and pastern and hock and pastern, hind legs well under him, speed equal to eight miles an hour on the road, and at least three miles at the plow, with sufficient blood to insure spirit and endurance; and no horse in this or any other class will be allowed to compete for a premium unless he be sound, that is, free from constitutional disease.

Table listing premiums for horses of all work, including categories like 'Stallion, 4 years old and upward' and 'Mare, 4 years old and upward'.

No. 2.—Draft Horses.

Table listing premiums for draft horses, including categories like 'Stallion, 4 years old and upward' and 'Span draft horses, tested by trial'.

NOTE.—No animal under 3 years old in this department is to be submitted to the trial test by the judges. ORVILLE STEWART, South Yamhill, Sup't.

No. 3.—Thoroughbreds.

Table listing premiums for thoroughbreds, including categories like 'Best Stallion, 4 years old and upward' and 'Best Oregon raised, 3 years old and upward'.

Mares same as horses.

No. 4.—Roadsters.

Table listing premiums for roadsters, including categories like 'Stallion, 4 years old and upward, to be tested by trial' and 'Span carriage horses'.

NOTE.—Horses competing in this department will be tested by trial. JOHN DOWNING, Superintendent.

No. 6.—Speed and Bottom.

Table listing premiums for speed and bottom, including categories like 'Running, single dash, for Oregon raised horses' and 'Running, mile heats, 2 in 3, free for all'.

NOTE.—Horses competing in this department will be tested by trial. E. B. DEUCE, Superintendent.

No. 7.—Sweepstakes.

Table listing premiums for sweepstakes, including categories like 'Stallion' and 'Best 3 year old stallion'.

NOTE.—All persons competing in this Class will understand that the committee will require all animals to be on the show grounds within fifteen minutes after the owner's name is called, in order to compete for premiums.

The person taking the largest number of premiums in this Class, to receive a gold medal; second best, silver medal.
