

FREMONT IN CONTEMPT.—The S. E. Bulletin says: A French Court has pronounced the defendants in the Memphis and El Paso Railroad case guilty of swindling, and sentenced them to various terms of imprisonment.

NORTHERN PACIFIC CONTRACT.—A Portland paper of the 9th inst., has the following: "The proposals for clearing and grubbing forty miles of road on the Northern Pacific were opened at Kalama, and forwarded to San Francisco to W. Milner Roberts, Chief Engineer, who is at present in that city. The road to be thus worked lies above Tenino and extends forty miles westward. We understand that J. B. Montgomery, who comes upon the Orilliamme, has the contract for doing this work and will commence operations with a large force of men immediately. Already, a considerable number of Chinamen have been forwarded to Kalama to be in readiness to begin the work in a moment's notice. The Vice-President and Chief Engineer, together with the entire Board of Directors, who are now on their way from the East, intend visiting the road in person when the work is commenced."
