

THE MARKETS.

Commercial.

There is nothing important or new in relation to prices of breadstuffs. Liverpool quotations remain as of late, and there is no change here because freight continue at figures that leave the price of wheat same as when freights were lower.

The Salem Mills have received by railroad 41,000 bushels of wheat from Eugene City, shipped by Mr. John Berry, their efficient agent; twenty six car loads were received in one day.

Coffee has decidedly advanced, averaging 6 to 8 cts per pound on all grades, and the prices at San Francisco and Portland are now higher than were recently the retail prices here in Salem.

FOREIGN.

LONDON, Dec. 31.—The inquiry into the Ville du Havre disaster embraced evidence as to the lights displayed on the two vessels and their position. Mr. Butt, Q. C., on behalf of the owners of the Lochearn, cross-examined the witnesses, endeavoring to show that something was wrong on board the Ville du Havre. The latter is still unrepresented by counsel.

MADRID, Jan. 2.—The Government has suppressed several newspapers with Federal proclivities.

Tuesday night a shell from the besieging batteries near Cartagena set fire to the insurgent ironclad Teluan, in the harbor of Cartagena. After burning for three hours the fire reached the magazine, which exploded with tremendous force, damaging surrounding vessels.

LONDON, Jan. 2.—Advices from Cape Coast Castle to December 15th, report that the Ashantees were driven across the river Praah, re-entering their own territory in great disorder. They left a large number of dead and wounded on the bank of the river. Wolsey was in pursuit with five hundred sailors. The troop-ships Himalaya and Tamar having arrived, everything was ready for an advance upon Coomassie. The Gold Coast is very unhealthy.

A special dispatch says that three hundred Ashantees were drowned in the river Praah in their flight before Wolsey.

MADRID, Jan. 3.—In the Cortes to-day the deputies, on two votes, gave a majority of 20 against President Castelar. General Pavla, who is friendly to Castelar, thereupon occupied the palace of the Cortes and other public buildings with fourteen thousand troops, dissolved the Cortes and summoned the most eminent men of all parties, including members of the present Government, and only excepting Carlists and Intransigent, to form a Government. This, General Pavla declared, was the only way for the salvation of the country. He refused personally to become a member of the Government. The streets are filled with people and there is great excitement, but no blood has been shed.

NEW YORK, Jan. 6.—At a special meeting of the Bar Association to-night a resolution was unanimously adopted condemning and earnestly protesting against the nomination of Geo. H. Williams as Chief Justice.
