LARGE CREESE VAT.—We saw yesterday a very large chose vat which has just been completed by Wade, Brown & Co. for Mr. Warren Craaston, as an accessory to his extensive dairy. The vat consists of two compartments, the one for the milk holding a little over 432 gallons. This is set into another and larger vat, and between the bottoms of the two there is a small space the entire length, which is about twelve feet. Into this space the water is conducted, and from here it passes through two three inch holes into one of H. Cooper's patent heaters, where a portion of it is beated, thus warming all the water under the milk and making it as casy matter to keep the milk at the proper temperature, there being an attachment by which the steam passages can be closed when the water in the vat is sufficiently hot. The apparatus is the same as one used by Mr. Henry Ankeny, only his was built in the East, and this one in Oregon, which makes it much less expensive than one of Eastern manufacture. ern manufacture.

SECRE WEATHER.—Late news from Wasco county shows that Winter has but recently set in there, and that it is the hardest ever known in that section. A friend showed us a letter yesterday, received from a friend at Bridge Creek in that county, under date of March 10th, which save: "We had a very fine Winter here until the first of February.
