We further learn from him that the reports concerning the disaffection and hostility of the Indians now on the Malheur reservation are very far from being true. Winnemucca's band asked leave to go away and were permitted to do so, and he asserts that agent Linville is doing well and having no difficulties of a serious character to contend with which we are glad to know is the case.

Mr. Brown meets his brother from Bay City, Michigan, whom he has not met for nearly, or quite twenty years, and in three weeks time expects to return with him to visit his old eastern home. His attachment to Oregon is such that he will not consent to make a permanent home elsewhere, but intends to return here after three months absence.

ANOTHER FIRE.—A few minutes after 8 o'clock Saturday evening, the residents in the block east of the Central school house were startled by the single cry of fire; and on looking out, discovered a small barn on the east side of the alley near the centre of the block, belonging to Mr. McNeil, to be in flames. Several men who lived close by were on the ground in a few seconds opening a way for the engines, which were there in an incredibly short time after the alarm was given down town; but the flames had made so much headway before discovered that the building was nearly consumed before any water was thrown. Tiger engine was first in position, but it took them some time to get water through their hose, and Captains got the first stream on the fire. Though the building in which the fire originated was entirely consumed, nothing else was burned, and the loss was inconsiderable. As to the origin of the fire, reports vary; though it is but just to say that, had it not been for the prompt response of the Department, in all probability it would have extended to other buildings and much valuable property would have been destroyed.
