The Right Hon. Sir Henry R. Storks, formerly a prominent officer of the British army and lately a member of Parliament, died in London lately.

The National Convention of Pharmacologists was opened at Louisville, Ky., Sept. 8th. The attendance of delegates was large, and includes the leading druggists from all parts of the country.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8.—The Treasury Department has been notified by the Collector of Customs of the existence of yellow fever at New Orleans, Galveston, Pensacola, Mobile, Key West, Darien and Brunswick (Georgia) and at the quarantine grounds of New York and Baltimore.

CHICAGO, Sept. 8.—An atrocious case of poisoning is reported from Washington Heights in this county. A hired man in the employ of O. E. Atwood on Sunday attempted, almost successfully, to murder an entire family, eight in all, by poison.

William Brunstead, ex-member of the Board of Public Works of Jersey City, and popularly designated as the Boss Tweed of that city, died there Sept. 8th. In 1872 he was convicted of conspiracy, but his wealth enabled him to escape punishment, and he has since operated entirely on Wall street, New York.

H. B. Rogers, a clerk in the Quartermaster's Department, at Camp Curtis, stood highest in the comparative examination for a cadetship at West Point.

Major Bigger, formerly of the Colorado Cavalry, is in New York, superintending the publication of his biography of Dick Wooten the Colorado pioneer.
