The Lincoln statue, which is to be dedicated soon at Springfield, Ill., is completed at Chicopee, Mass., and a special car has arrived to carry it to its destination.

The incomplete returns of the registration of taxable property in the city of Philadelphia (four divisions being still unaccounted) show an increase of 11,996 names.
