THIS PLOW IS THE INVENTION OF A. B. Kellogg, of Kellogg's P. O., Douglas county, Oregon, and has received a United States patent therefor. This is not merely a new plow, but an improvement that can be attached to an old plow, if desirable, as well as constructed as a new one. It consists of a point, land-side, and share on the land-side for cutting under the land, constructed of one piece of sheet metal, cut out in suitable form and bent in the shape required.

The proprietors intend to have a limited number of these plows made by good mechanics, without charge for royalty, to prove their value, and those who desire to examine same, can do so at Knight's blacksmith shop, Foundry Block, Salem, or at L. L. Kellogg's shop, Oakland, Oregon.

Our improvement on plows will be manufactured and sold by Louis Miller, Albany; and by Irwin, Racey, and Schoelling, and Woodbury, at Harrisburg; and by Sloan Brothers, and Foidoxter & Pugh, at Eugene.
