Another great engineering work apparently is on the eve of accomplishment, one which should transform Algeria and the north of Africa, and exert no inconsiderable influence on the commerce of France; indeed, of the whole civilized world.

Having obtained the necessary furlough, with recommendations to the colonial authorities, he set out on his mission, but his efforts were so poorly seconded by them, and they so exaggerated the dangers and difficulties of the work of exploration, that finally he set out unaccompanied on a trip that was to last thirteen months and be full of vicissitudes.

From Biskra he returned direct to Algiers, where his success was warmly applauded by General Chanzy, and going to Paris he prepared, with the approval of the Minister of War, a long, clear and valuable paper for the Revue des Deux Mondes that attracted much attention in the scientific world.

How the Russians Propose to Reach the North Pole.

The Russian Geographical Society has a scheme for reaching the Pole not altogether unlike that proposed by Captain Hovgaard, but by a different route. The scheme was elaborated some time ago, but has never yet been put into practical operation.

The expedition from the colony to the Pole was to consist of ten sledges, with six men to each sledge. The distance to be travelled may be roughly estimated at 500 miles, divided into ten stages of fifty miles each.

It was only a few years ago that swine breeders were vying with each other for the greatest weight of carcasses; but this is now all changed. Hogs that will weigh 500 pounds are sold at less price per pound than those of 250 to 300 pounds.

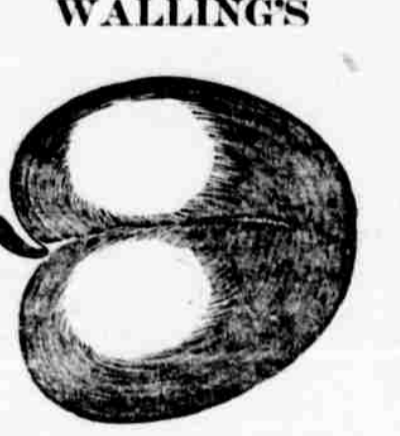
