Answers to Inquiries

Ed. Farmer: In your last issue I notice inquiries from Seaside, which you request some reader of experience to answer. Not seeing any response, I will endeavor briefly to answer your correspondent's inquiries.

Second, the quantity of lime per acre required to develop the greatest fertility in the soil, depends on the class and condition of soil to be improved. Strong, heavy, new soils will bear 100 bushels of unslaked lime to the acre at one dressing, while lighter soils that have been impoverished by many years of bad farming, will often be "burnt out."

SEEDS THAT BURN.—Having fairly disposed of plants which set traps for and catch insects; which often when the unwary fly alights on them; which will quickly distinguish between a piece of fresh beef and a piece of chalk, Mr. Darwin, in a late copy of Nature, calls attention to the discovery by Herr Fritz Muller of more than a dozen grasses and one species of geranium, growing in Brazil, whose seeds possess these peculiarities. They are furnished with awns which, twisting by the action upon their cells of an alternate moist and dry atmosphere, when lying upon the ground, the hydroscopic torsion causes the seeds to penetrate into the soil. In one of the most singular specimens, belonging to the genus Aristida, the seeds have three-tined awns, five or six inches long, which, projecting to three directions more or less at right angles with the seed, serve to hold it in an upright position, with its lower end resting on the ground in the most favorable manner for being into the earth.

POTATO SPROUTS.—A correspondent of the Country Gentleman claims that the sprouts from potatoes, usually broken off and thrown away, being considered by most growers as an injury, will produce better and earlier crops than the usual cuttings. He writes: "I have taken the sprouts from Early Rose potatoes that were stored for seed, broken them off and planted in drills at the same time I did the potatoes, and have invariably got good sized eating potatoes about ten days to two weeks earlier. In fact, last season those from the sprouts were ahead of the potatoes, while the next were covered with them. This I have done for several years in success."

Street Commissioner, R. H. Price, has put in four days work on the Fair Ground road and about four hundred wagon-cads of fine gravel, filling up all the "chuck holes," and by this evening, this thoroughfare will be in the top condition, and ready for the pioneers and their friends. This stretch of road, in a few days will be the best in Marion county.
