Marion County Bible Society. The Annual Meeting of the Marion County Bible Society was held Saturday evening in the Congregational Church. The report of the Treasurer showed that there has been received during the year from the sales of books \$102 97; from donations, \$55 50; total, \$158 47. Amount paid out for books, \$57 70; donated to State Bible Society, \$84 50; amount paid for freight \$1 97; balance on hand \$43 21. There was at the beginning of the year, books in the Depository valued at \$145 25; purchased, \$78 80; total, \$225 05. Value of books donated, \$5 50; value of books delivered to life members, \$1 60; value of books sold, \$81 90; value of books on hand, \$139 09. A committee of three, consisting of R. H. Moss, J. J. McFarland and H. Dipple was appointed to report at the Union Services, held in the State street M. E. Church last evening, for the purpose of nominating officers for the ensuing year. No further business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
