

THE FISHERIES AWARD.

The Fishery Commission, sitting at Halifax, Nova Scotia, has decided adversely to the United States, and voted an award to Great Britain of \$5,500,000.

The Austrian Commiss'r sided with England, and the award was fixed as above, the sum to be paid within one year.

At the conclusion of the speaking a temporary organization of a Greenback Club was formed by the election of Hon. G. W. Lawson President, and P. A. Graves, Esq., Secretary.

Fifty-nine names were put down as members of the new organization, which will be perfected as soon as the necessary documents are received from the National organization.

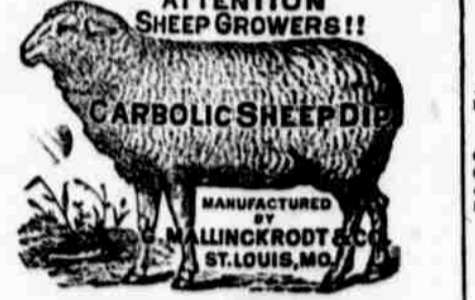
