It extends from francs; 59-franc pieces, 46,5d8,700 francs; 40franc pieces, 204,432,360 francs; 20-franc pieces 6.708,899,520 isanes; 10-franc pieces, 1,013,-614,610 francs; 5-franc pieces, 233,440,130 francs. Of gold coin, 20-franc pieces only were struck in 1877, their value being 255, 181, 140 france, and their number 12,759,057. The total number of franc pieces was 93,000,000, and of half-franc pieces 89,000,000. 
