The present trouble results from a collision between rival bands of outlaws, one order Capt. Bill. Strong of home guard fame, and the other coder Jack Ailman. The Strong party took confor Jack Aikman. The Strong party took pessession of the town on Monday, commit-ting many note of lawlessness and getting reckless with drink. During the afternoon the Aikman party, 12 or 15 strong, rode into the town and made an attack on the Strongs. Thirty or forty shots were discharged, two taking effect on William and Daniel Free-man, the former being shot through the body and the latter through the head. They were and the latter through the head. They were removed late in the evening to their homes, several miles up the river. Daniel Freeman is recovering but William is dead. Strong and his followers received up injuries but encamped themselves in a cabin about 100 yards off, where they had previously stacked their arms. Aikman and his party sought shelter in the court house and at regular inter-vals change of shots was kept up during the whole afternoon. One of the Freemans, who fell in the middle of the street when who fell in the inside of the street when shot, was forced to lie there for two hours, his friends fearing to attempt his removal. During the strife, hideous yells and shouts of defiance could be heard from both parties. The next merning (Thursday) it was discovered that Aikman and party had with drawn from the court house and quartered themselves on the river bank, while Strong themselves on the reafter a band of drunken men well armed began to be strong themselves of the lower court because, by the fault of the processing attempt, he had never benz arranged.


