San Francisco Market. Wheat—Offerings, especially of choice, are smaller; demand better, and mostly for export; market maintains firm, and steady feeling, with great confidence in present prices, as there is no selling pressure; quotations are fair to good.

Chicago Market. Wheat—33 to 34 per bush for April delivery. Beerbohm's Wheat Market. Flouting cargo steamer, held higher; cargoes on cargo and for shipment, American is neglected, whilst there is good demand for other sorts; Mark Lane unaltered.

Commercial. The continued storms, for weeks past, have made business generally dull at Portland and elsewhere, and it is also true that times are hard and money scarce through the country.

There is no change to record in the grain trade. Vessels hold for higher prices, and the late improvement in English prices is swallowed up by advance in freights. It is not probable that we shall have sufficient grain to ship as to make tonnage scarce.

There is no decline or weakness in England, but the market is reported firm at former quotations. What may happen to change the situation is not easy to foresee.

need a good deal of wheat to keep their mills at work, and the home demand may influence the market, as it did two years ago. Statistics from the New York World, which we publish below, show that winter wheat only looks well in our own state, and has suffered heavy damage by the winter. If fall wheat suffers in the United States and Europe as there stated, there may be a deficiency to affect the price after next harvest.

The World publishes statistics of the first half of the crop year as now made up. Reducing flour to wheat and partly estimating the movement from the Pacific Coast, we exported for the six months ending on the first of March about 74,000,000 bushels of wheat, leaving 45,000,000 bushels yet to go forward between the 1st of March and the 1st of September. The reports from Atlantic ports were about 65,000,000 bushels, of which 32,000,000 went to the continent, 28,000,000 to Great Britain and the remainder to other countries.

Ordinary produce shows no change, except that fresh butter is more plentiful and price for choice quotable at 27 1/2 cents to 30 cents per pound. Eggs are plentiful and cheap, 16 cents per dozen being the ruling price.

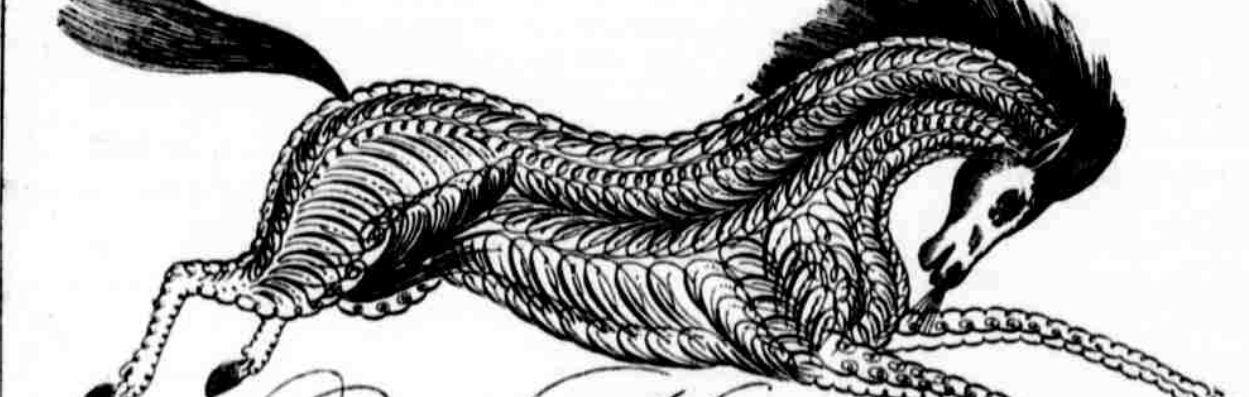
