Commercial.

TRUESDAY MOENING, May 1st, 1879. We give in our market report all that is known of trade at this time. There is no excitement in business circles. Wheat does not move; there are no considerable sales to note; no shipe are chartered for there are no MUSICAL JOURNAL cargoes to be bought. All matters relating to produce are at a stand-still and will hardly experience any decided change until some catimate can be made of the extent of production through the world in the coming harvest.

We hear of no transactions, no satisfactory feeling in the wool market. Even that is lifeless, but will probably assume shape when the spring clip comes into market.

LONDON, April 29. The Mark Lane Express saye: The condition of growing wheat is backward on the low lands of Scotland, while backward on the low lands of Scotland, while heavy rains and snow have stopped spring sowing in the higher districts. Supplies of English wheat at country markets have been fairly liberal, and prices slightly improved. At Mark Lane offerings are light; buyers only respond to the firmness of holders by taking the choicest lots at full prices. Last week's imports of foreign into London were fair, last Monday's returns showing the arrival of \$,000 quarters, while subsequent returns to Priday showed 18,000 quarters. Supplies at Liverpool have been unusually heavy. Trade

An improved demand followed the inactivity caused by the holidays, but the absence of speculation confined business to the supply of present requirements and stocks have dimished slowly. Prices were little changed as supply and demand balance evenly. The large visible supply in America is likely to be

counteracted by the unsatisfactory agricultural outlook and large needs of France. Some serts of American were cheaper. Nearly all spring wheat from the Atlantic ports was very poor, being purchasable at 35s@36s for No. 3 Chicago, and 39s for No. 3 Milwankee, per 480 lbs cost of freight and insurance.

The sales of wheat last week were 53,480 cm at 40 km. qrs at 40s 11d, against 38,555 qrs at 51s 8d for same period of last year.
