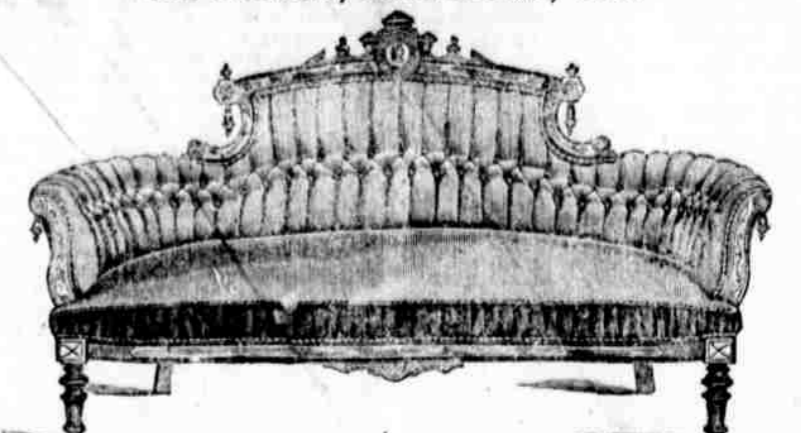

KILLED WHILE ASLEEP. The Sad Fate of a Sixteen-Year-Old Boy in Jackson County. On the night of Saturday, the 19th ult., says the Jacksonville Times, Grand Cove mountain, four miles from Parker's steam saw mill, on Big Butte creek, was the scene of a lamentable accident which resulted in the instant death of Orrin Armstrong, a sixteen-year-old son of Reuben S. Armstrong.

THE DEATH OF LYMAN HALL, ASSISTANT ENGINEER OF THE STEAMSHIP ALEX. DUNCAN. The San Francisco Chronicle of the 25th ult. contains the following: "Lyman P. Hall, assistant engineer of the steamer Alex. Duncan, was drowned on the 20th inst at Moro bay. He was one of a party of four gathering mussels on Moro rock, when, contrary to advice, he left the party to go to a small rock in advance, when a heavy sea swept him into the current, which is very swift, and thence to the ocean. The boat being some distance off much time was lost before assistance could be rendered.
