

STEAMSHIP WILLAMETTE.

Arrival of the First Ship of the U. S. Co's. Colliers--Quick Passage. The fine new steamship Willamette, built at Chester, Pennsylvania, for the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company, arrived at Astoria dock at 7 o'clock Tuesday morning.

IMPORTANT MILITARY CHANGES--The latest military item is that the two artillery companies stationed at Fort Canby and Stevens--those of Throckmorton and Morris--will go to California to relieve the companies of Major Campbell at Black Point and Major Eagan at Fort Point. The change will not take place till July. The two latter companies will be stationed at Fort Canby under command of Major Graham, thus vacating the already partially dismantled Fort Stevens.

NARROW ESCAPE--A son of Mr. A. Nelson, living near Independence, met with a narrow escape last Monday while engaged in rolling wheat; his team became frightened and ran away. The young man was thrown from his seat and one end of the heavy roller passed over his body. He was seriously hurt but it is hoped not fatally injured.

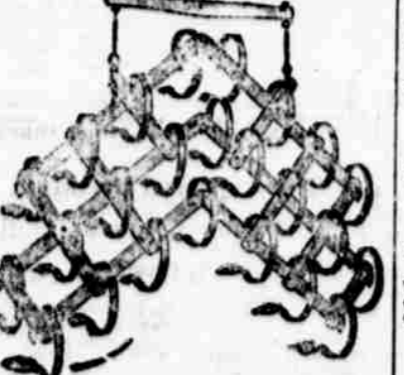
