MARKET REPORT.

HOME PRODUCE MARKET. The following represent wholesale rates from producers or first hands: FLOUR.—In jobbing lots standard brands, \$4.75@5.00; best country brands, \$4.25@4.75.

GENERAL MERCHANDISE. RICE.—China, No. 1, 6c; China No. 2, 5c; Japan, 7c; Sandwhich Islands, 8c@9c. TEAS.—Japan, 40c@50c@65c; Black, 40c@75c; Green, 65c@80c.

THURSDAY, Oct. 27th, 1881. The forcing of immense quantities of wheat upon the world's markets has the natural effect to keep prices down and freights up, and it may be considered a remarkable proof of the stability of the present market for breadstuffs, that while this immense pressure to sell grain exists prices abroad hold up as well as they do.

By reason of free arrivals of deep water vessels, some of them having 24 charters, failing to arrive within the time limited, have been thrown upon the market, and thus forced to accept lower rates. A spot American vessel, wooden, has been chartered to a direct port at \$3 12-64, which is a decided decline.

Wool.—The market continues in a lifeless state, buyers still insisting that prices here are relatively higher than those in Eastern markets. Not a little is, however, being holed, preparatory to shipment East whenever a ship is laid on for New York or Boston at a reasonable freight rate.

to be no reason for any holder of hops to hurry to sell as yet, but it is not easy to see the bottom of the hop business. Apples are abundant, and the market overstocked with inferior grades. Prices range from 50 to 60 cents. Pears average about 62 1/2 cents a bushel.

San Francisco Markets. SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 26. Wheat.—The market is unfavorably affected by Liverpool advices; buyers bid lower, among sales yesterday were 100 tons extra choice shipping at \$1.77 1/2; 175 tons choice shipping, \$1.76 1/2; it is doubtful if the sale could be duplicated to-day; no sales of No. 1 reported; \$1.75 bid for choice shipping.

Our Wheat Production. NEW YORK, Oct. 26.—The Commercial Bulletin makes a careful estimate on the basis of figures furnished yesterday by the department at Washington in regard to the acreage and yield of wheat per acre in each of the states this year, and concludes the total harvest of the country to be 381,400,000 bushels of wheat, against 458,100,000 in 1879, and by a revised estimate it is shown the wheat crop of 1881 falls 117,100,000 bushels below that of last year.

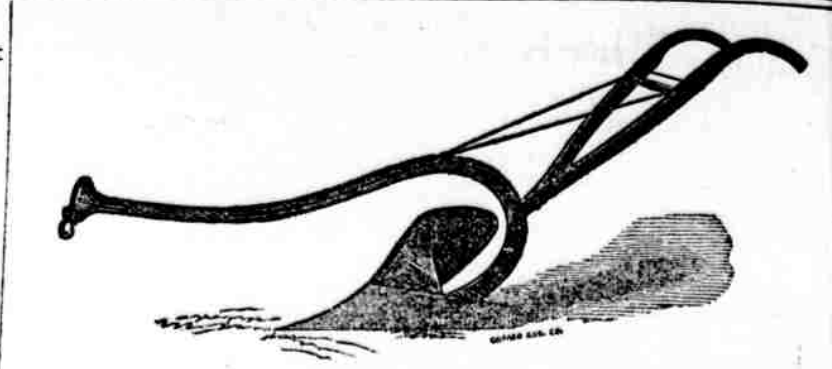
