The British iron ship, E. Kdale, to Liverpool direct, at 15 which is far above rates here.

Wheat.—Call sales in futures during the week have been of some importance, as detailed herewith. Present spot price for extra choice No. 1 white, \$1.75 1/2... The British Government is undoubtedly making an effort to liberate the kingdom from dependence upon the United States and Russia for wheat to supply the deficiency of the home production.

Wool.—The market is exceedingly inert. Sales are, however, reported of 50,000 lbs. of pure and low grade California fall at 90¢ to 100¢... The market is firm at steady prices. Attention is called to the large increase of flour receipts in Europe, as compared with years gone by.

Wheat.—The spot market seems to be lifeless at 85¢ to 90¢ for good to choice, W. H. & H. Le Ma, under date of London, Nov. 29th, report: Business on this market is restricted by the supplies being so short... The imports of foreign wheat into England last week were 3,952 bales, and for the corresponding week last year were 2,478 bales.

Wheat.—The supply is good. We quote wheat at \$1.70 to \$1.75; soft white, \$1.50 to \$1.55; No. 1, \$1.75 to \$1.80; No. 2, \$1.60 to \$1.65; No. 3, \$1.45 to \$1.50; No. 4, \$1.30 to \$1.35; No. 5, \$1.15 to \$1.20.
