MARKET REPORT.

so that the damage done by winter frosts is compensated for. The dead wheat was re-sown and has prospered abundantly.

The wool market, also, is down and liable to remain low. Eastern wools sell at 14 cts to 20 cts. As yet little valley wool is in market.

Reports from New York and the East speak of overproduction of wools and overstocks of goods. It is said that heavy sales of cassimere have been made at 25 per cent off of regular rates.

The hop market shows no particular activity, but the prospects for a good round price is flattering, and already twenty-seven cents has been offered.

When it is taken into consideration that ten cents is a fair equivalent for hops, and a price at which money can be made by curing, it is no use denying that there is a great future in store for our hop growers.

Taken together Pierce and King counties will probably compare favorably with those of any other two counties in the United States engaged in this culture, aggregating some 1,700 acres of hop which, at the average yield of 1,000 pounds an acre for old and new fields would amount to a total harvest of 2,550,000 pounds.

There are but few changes in the local markets, and they will be found complete in the report at the head of this department.

Mark Lane Review.

LONDON, June 11.—The Mark Lane Express, in its review of the grain trade for the past week says: Good crops and a vigorous stand promise well for harvest.

California Crops and Markets

From the San Francisco Commercial Herald of June 7th, we learn: The weather is good for growing crops and a more brilliant outlook could not be wished for.

Since our last weekly reference some half dozen ships have been secured for spot wheat loading at some advance upon like previous charters and upon the basis of 42c 6d @ 43c 6d, and for new crop 60c is generally asked for iron and 55c for large American carriers.

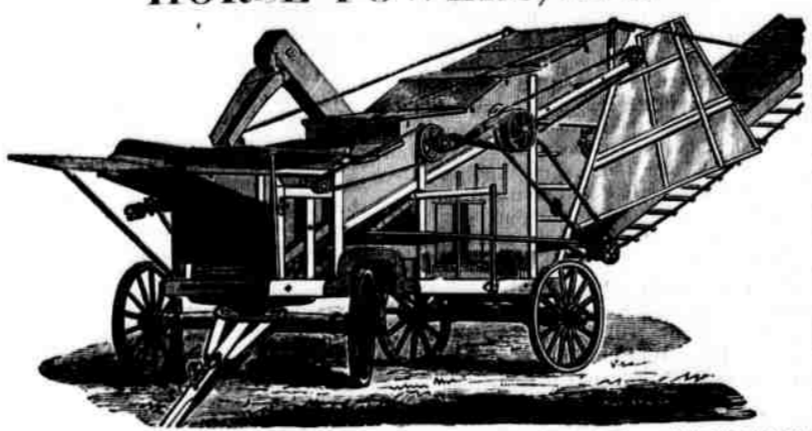
Flour—Local supplies are free and liberal and at declining rates in sympathy with the fall wheat. Oregon continues to send us our surplus. We quote: Extras at \$5.50 @ 5.75; country brands, extras, \$4.75 @ 5.25; extra superfine, \$4.25; superfine, \$3.75 @ 4.00.

Hops—Dealers now charge brewers, 75c @ 80c; but we have good reason to believe that late arrivals can be bought at 40c @ 50c. We know of an invoice of Washington Territory hops, sold preemptively at 30c by orders from this city.

Oats—The market dull and lower. The demand in light view of the early approach to harvest. We quote the spot market at \$2.10 @ 2.35 per cwt for extra choice; No. 1, \$1.95 @ 2.05; No. 2, \$1.80 @ 1.90.

Hide—Heavy salted steers, 90 @ 100; light salted hides, cows and steers, 30 @ 45 lbs, \$9 @ 10; medium do, 45 @ 55 lbs, 9 @ 10; small do, 10 @ 12; hair goat, good demand for pump skins, 14 @ 15; hair goat, sound skins, 6 @ 7; medium, 3 @ 4; small skins and kid, 5 @ 6; deer skins, good summer skins, 1 @ 2; heavy skins, long hair, 3 @ 4; deer skins, 2 @ 3; short wool, 3 @ 4; medium wool, 6 @ 8; long wool, \$1 @ 1.40; dry hides, unusual selection, 17c; dry kip, 17c; do, calf, 17 @ 20.

Wheat—The spot market shows no improvement either in demand or values. \$1 05 is an extreme price for choice shipping; futures are lower. No. 1 white sells for \$1.56 @ 1.57; closed at \$1.56.

Barley—On spot, easy at a shade lower prices; quote 90 @ 95c; futures selling at a decline; No. 1 feed, September, 80c; seller the year opened 86c; closed at 85c.

Potatoes—The market is firmer; boxes, \$1 31 @ 1.37; sacks, \$7.40 @ \$1.12.

Wool—Weak; buyers manifest the same indifference as previously noted; quotations merely nominal.

Eggs—Market poorly supplied with extra choice qualities; prices steady at 28 @ 29c, perhaps 30c.

Butter—Prices are not very high, but a slight tendency in seller's favor is noted for choice grades; poor qualities weak and neglected.

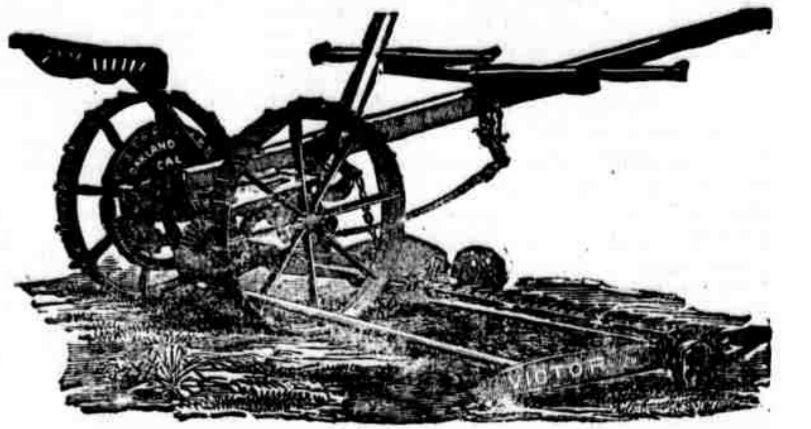

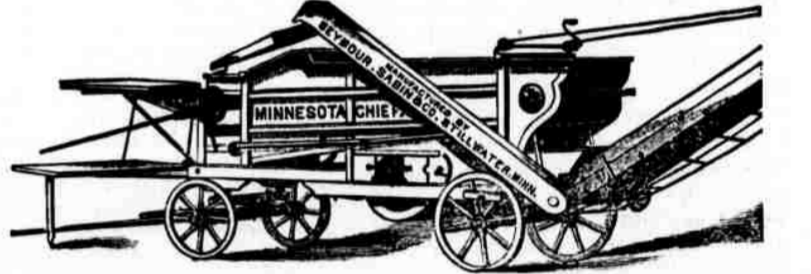
