To measure corn in the bin (corn on the ear) find the cubic feet—that is multiply the length in feet by the breadth and thickness. Thus if 8 feet wide, 12 feet long, and corn 6 feet deep: 8x12 makes 96; that by 6, makes 576 cubic feet. Point off the last figure with a decimal point thus, 57.6. Divide by 2, which gets 28.8, then multiply by 9, which makes 259.2; or say in round numbers 260 bushels of shelled corn.
