COMMERCIAL.

PORTLAND, JAN. 20, 1887.

Our rainy weather continues with a prospect that it will last awhile longer. There has been a very heavy rainfall since Monday. Some of this rain has visited California, much to the satisfaction of wheat growers and dealers, who were holding back shipments for fear of a dry year and light crops.

Eggs are dull at 20 cts per dozen, and are bound to be abundant from this time on. Hops are nominal, at 19 to 20c per pound, and the eastern demand continues light, and no improvement in prices. Locally, the market is about as quoted last week, with a trifle weaker feeling.

LET THE STATE DO IT. We heartily endorse the proposition that the State of Oregon shall undertake the construction of a ship railway at The Dalles. It is within our means as a State, and the object is so important that it warrants some risk on the part of Oregon to secure it.
