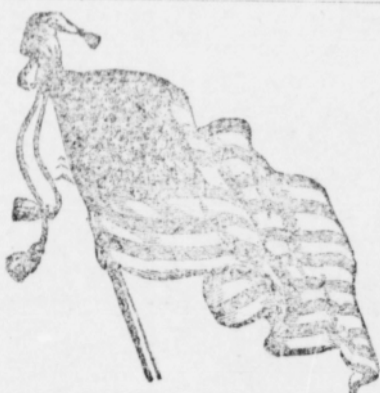

The Council Meeting.

Proposition for City Water Works Dis-
 cussed and Committee Appointed.

Last Monday night was the reg-
 ular meeting night for the trustees
 of the city. President Williams
 called the meeting to order with a
 full attendance of councilmen.
 Minutes read and approved.

The committee appointed to as-
 certain the cost and prepare plans
 for a city water works submitted
 the proposition of J. J. Houck with
 a diagram of the proposed system.
 After considerable debating a mo-
 tion was made to appropriate \$400
 of the towns money for the water
 system, provided the balance of the
 amount required could be raised
 by subscription and the water pro-
 cured at reasonable rates.

Councilmen Beidler, Rolls and
 Pate were appointed to confer with
 the business men and citizens and
 ascertain what could be raised to-
 ward the proposition.

Dan Richard's bill of \$4 for hall
 rent was read and allowed. A
 warrant being ordered drawn for
 its payment.

The bills of W. A. Carter for
 \$13.50 for services as city recorder.
 W. C. Hubbard for \$46.55 for ser-
 vices as marshal and the bill of the
 News Printing Co. for printing \$3;
 were referred to the finance com-
 mittee for investigation.

W. C. Hubbard was allowed \$25
 on his bill by motion and a warrant
 ordered drawn for its payment.

A petition was presented and
 read containing 30 names asking
 for the repeal of the stock ordinance.
 There was also a remonstrance
 against its repeal containing 34
 names.

After considering the matter the
 board repealed the ordinance by
 motion with a vote of 4 to 1.

Council adjourned until Thurs-
 day night at 7:30.

ADJOURNED MEETING.

Last night the council met in an
 adjourned meeting from Monday
 night. All the board being present
 The minutes of Monday nights
 session read and approved. The
 finance committee reported on the
 bills of W. C. Hubbard, W. A.
 Carter and the N. P. Co. Hubbard
 being cut down to \$38.55, Carter
 to \$12.55 and the N. P. Co. to \$1.50
 C. H. Dalrymple was allowed \$5.00
 for his services as city attorney.

The water committee asked for
 more time which was granted.

Council adjourned.
