Co-Operative Brotherhood.

A Spokane Union That Invited Debs to Washington.

Spokane, Wash., June 22.—Organized last winter in Spokane, the Brotherhood of the Co-operative Commonwealth is now a flourishing organization, and is the one that first held out inducements to Eugene V. Debs to locate his co-operative colony in this state. For months the local union, which is affiliated with the national union, now in session in Chicago, has been in correspondence with Debs, the national organizer, looking to effecting a colonization of large areas of land in this state. At the head of the local union is William E. Richardson, judge of the superior court of Spokane and Stevens counties, who, in an interview today, stated his faith in the plan and declared that it cannot fail.

Debs will be at Wallace, Idaho, July 11, the anniversary of the great Coeur d'Alene strike, to participate in the annual celebration on that date. From there he will come to Spokane to consult with the local union on the colony. The local union has conducted its affair quietly, and not until today was its existence known.
