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THE QUEEN'S JUBILEE

LONDON DECORATED IN HOLIDAY GRAB.

Eight Millions of People Throng the Streets of the Great Metropolis—The Great Jubilee Day—Fifty Thousand Soldiers Parade.

King Carnival reigns in the Queen's capital, this being the week when the celebration of the sixtieth year of the reign of Victoria as Queen of England takes place. London is in masquerade disguise, and is unrecognizable except at points where stately architecture, like that of the Houses of Parliament and Westminster abbey, defined with its noble sobriety the decorator's work. Through the narrow streets rushes by night and day, a swollen torrent of sight-seers. Business is at a stand-

still and traffic in all the leading thoroughfares is blocked for hours at a time. Between the regular and volunteer soldiers there is a temporary garrison of 50,000 men for parading and lining the streets. An estimate of the number of visitors present Queen's day—Tuesday—was 8,000,000.

The celebration commenced Sunday and lasts seven days. The leading feature of the great event was the parade of Tuesday. No English monarch had, at any previous time, made so long a progress through the metropolis as was effected by Queen Victoria. The great procession left Buckingham Palace and traveled for miles through the streets of London. All along the line of march were great and handsome arches, decorated grandly, and with pretty, gaily and endless street decorations, presented a scene that is beyond description. The streets were crowded with an admiring, loyal crowd of Britons, who extended to their Queen as she passed an enthusiastic reception.

The celebration of the balance of the week consisted of a grand naval display, royal receptions and celebrating generally.

HAWAII TO BE ANNEXED.

The Islands To Become Part of the United States July 4, 1898.

July 4, 1898, will be celebrated not only in the United States as Independence day, but in the Hawaiian islands as annexation day. Realizing that the treaty cannot be put into form of law at this session, the Administration will make no effort to press consideration, but will have a report made and then allow public opinion to take its course, confident that many opponents of annexation now will be supporters of the treaty when the next session is called. The plan now is to have the treaty passed as early in the next session as possible, thus giving to Hawaii a chance to notice that there will be an abrogation of all treaties with other countries. This will bring the country free of all alliances into the United States by the middle of next year. A provision of the treaty is to the effect that after annexation no Chinese will be allowed to land on the islands, and those now there will not be allowed to land in this country.

Japan Protests.

The Japanese Minister has filed with the Secretary of State a formal statement of the position of his government with respect to the proposed annexation of the Hawaiian island by the United States. Although it is officially denied that Japan has protested against the annexation treaty, it is admitted that the government has represented in the strongest terms its rights in Hawaii should be fully protected in case of annexation.

President McKinley and his cabinet will take part in the ceremony attending the unveiling of the John A. Logan statue at Chicago.

The National History building at the University of Illinois was struck by lightning one morning last week and damaged to the extent of \$75,000.

Relatives of the late Barney Barnato are springing up all over the country, and each claims to have a claim on the estate of the late "diamond king."

It is announced from Washington that President McKinley is known to have expressed himself as favorable to the admission of the remaining territories as full-fledged states.

While bathing in a lake six miles from Greenville, Tex., Cashier King of the First National bank, Miss Austin and Ida Scheneck, prominent residents of that city, were drowned.

William Gleason, a porter at the Hotel Metropole, while running the elevator was caught at the sixth floor and crushed to death while attempting to close the door with the elevator in motion.

For the next two years Colorado will be distinguished as the only state in the Union where the Fourth of July, Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years, Washington's birthday and Memorial day are not legal holidays.
