A tramway cable weighing 17,000 pounds was carried to the Nellie mine at Telluride, Colo., last week, on the backs of sixty-four mules. The mules were about 10 feet apart, each carrying a small roll.

The special train carrying the Oregon Christian Endeavor delegates narrowly escaped being wrecked near Cottonwood, Cal., last week. A bridge had been burned out and was discovered just in time to flag the train by Chas. Broadhurst, a farmer living near by.

Bob Hinman was convicted of having attempted to kill Wm. Huggins, who was trying to arrest him, near Riddle, Douglas county, sometime ago, and Judge Fullerton sentenced him to five years' imprisonment. He was taken to the penitentiary on a stretcher.

A hot wave struck New York city one day last week and the thermometer ran up to 102. As a result one death and 11 prostrations from heat occurred during the day. There have since been a number of like occurrences there and elsewhere in the East.

Work will begin on the Gold Hill Hotel next Monday. When this addition is completed our city will have a hotel with rooms to accommodate quite a crowd.
