A recent publication by the New York Journal of Commerce shows the full legal-tender silver money of the United States to be \$549,300,000; of France, \$434,000,000; of Spain, \$23,000,000; of Germany, \$105,000,000; of the Straits Settlements, \$115,000,000; of China,

\$750,000,000 and of India \$950,000,000. Of the \$4,053,000,000 silver money in the world today, all but \$620,000,000 is full legal tender and more than half of it has been coined since 1873. These figures are published by the New York Journal of Commerce, a conservative and extremely accurate paper, whose statements on subjects of this character are always accepted as reliable.

The Dingley tariff bill is now a law. It passed the Senate Saturday, by a vote of 40 to 30 and was signed by President McKinley the same day.

John Smith Griffin, born in Vermont in 1807, who came to Oregon in 1839, and Mrs. Mary Wood, born in the eastern states in 1793, who came to Oregon in 1823. Mrs. Wood was 104 years old on May 20th.

Interest in the Clondyke gold fields is rapidly growing. Some California pears, badly affected with San Jose scale, were officially condemned and destroyed at Salem last week by the horticultural commissioners. Several boxes of peaches, said to have come from Jackson county, were taken off the market, it being alleged that they were covered with peach moth. As the pest has not been noticed in this section heretofore, it is thought that it is confounded with brown rot, a fungus that blemishes the peach but does not injure it. Growers cannot be too particular as to the quality of fruit they send out, as it will hurt their reputation.—Times.
