that my kind of bimetalism does not prevail there, and the same condition is seen in all free-coinage countries the world over. A bimetalism that stops at the mints and never reaches the common people may suit our fusionist friends, but it is not the kind that will help me nor any other man who belongs to the 'plain-people' class of our citizens.

"There is not a gold-standard country anywhere that does not use nearly or quite as much silver as gold. This fact is not denied by anybody, so there is nothing for my friend of practical bimetalism to do but to support the only system which produces it. A thousand theories can be exploded by one stubborn fact, and this fact remains undisputed, that the law you are asking for never produces the system you want, so we are opposed to your law. I would rather have the system we want, without the law, than to have the law you want, without the system. In other words, I would rather be practical than visionary. Neither does your allegation that our financial system is copied from England any longer serve to frighten people. It would mean nothing, even if it were true, which it is not. Many good things have come to us from England; the very language we use in our denomination of 'goldbug' comes from England, and every fusionist in Oregon ought to be ashamed of himself for not employing in this patriotic pastime our purely American Chinook, and thus prove his independence of the 'British yoke.' There is no word in any language on earth, and never will be, that is half so expressive as the purely American word 'cultus,' and just now any silver man can refuse to use it and employ in its stead such a distinctively English word as 'plutocra' and afterward look the Stars and Stripes in the face, is beyond comprehension.

"If it should ever become necessary to look to a foreign country for a financial system to copy from, I would prefer to go to our mother country, with her intelligence and commercial supremacy, than to Mexico, with her half-civilization and \$5 per capita money circulation."
