These correspondents and editors, however, must have something to write about or they will lose their jobs, and as the Spaniards no longer furnish material, they turn their poisoned pens upon American patriots. As the opportunity of making themselves famous subsides they choose that course that will make them infamous. The two names, Abraham Lincoln and Wilkes Booth, will go down through history side by side. The one famous, the other infamous. So these assaulters of Alger and Shafter and other responsible officials are of the same character as Wilkes Booth.

PROPOSED REGISTRATION LAW.

SALEM, Sept. 28.—A bill for a registration law has been introduced in the house by Hill of Multnomah, in accordance with the pledge made by him during the campaign. He says the bill was drawn on lines suggested by the late Judge L. L. McArthur, and was carefully revised by Judge W. W. Thayer. Other able lawyers of the state also rendered assistance in framing the bill. It is a voluminous document, and these are its chief points:

Judges and clerks of election are to meet at the usual place of voting on the first Monday in May preceding each general election for the purpose of registering voters, and shall sit for two days from 9 A. M. to 5 P. M. It is made the duty of each elector to apply for registration in the precinct where he shall reside. Judges shall require proof of citizenship and other qualifications, and failure to supply it will disqualify the applicant for registration. The county clerk shall copy the names registered in the precincts into a county register, and any person rejected by the precinct judges may apply to the county judge or circuit judge for redress. Provision is made for the voting of qualified electors who may not be on the registration lists. Punishment by heavy fine and imprisonment is provided for fraudulent registration. All general and special elections are to be held under this act.

An error has got abroad in the state to the effect that the legislature can only transact business along the line suggested by the governor, when called in special session. It is supposed that the governor's suggestions may be communicated in his call for the special meeting, or in his message after the legislature convenes, but that he must outline the work to be done. Such is not the case, however. Of course, the governor has the privilege of making recommendations, and they will probably be treated with respect, but the legislature will have power to go beyond such recommendations or disregard them altogether. When it once assembles, whether in special or regular session, the legislature is its own judge of what it shall do.

In the present instance, however, sentiment seems to be in favor of leaving general legislation to go over to the regular session in January.
