W. H. ("Coin") Harvey has resigned as general manager of the ways and means committee of the democratic committee, and Sam B. Cook, of Missouri, has been appointed in his place. Harvey gives as the cause of his resignation that he could not get the committee to

agree on what he thought was a practical, businesslike and aggressive policy.

The new game law passed by the late legislature makes the close season for deer from November 1st to July 15th; beaver are wholly protected for twenty years: pheasants, grouse, prairie chickens and quail are to be killed during the month of November only; Mongolian pheasants are wholly protected in Jackson, Josephine, Coos, Curry and Clatsop counties for a period of three years. The penalty for violation of this law is a fine of from \$15 to \$200; together with cost of prosecution.

Frank Davey, of Salem, recently appointed a member of the state board of immigration, filed his oath of office with the secretary of state Wednesday.

A large colony of Dutch have arrived at Ontario, Malheur county, direct from Holland, with \$100,000 to invest in fruit lands and industries on this line.

Stock feed is running short at Baker City and ranchers thereabouts fear a severe loss of cattle and sheep if spring is much longer delayed. Baked hay sells in that city at \$20 per ton.

A third remittance on account of state taxes, amounting to \$4000, was received at the state treasury Wednesday from Jackson county, making \$10,000 out of a total of \$25,516 71 due, paid by it.

John Hanks, sentenced to two years for larceny, and Nick Jenkins sentenced to four years for rape, were received at the penitentiary Tuesday morning from Douglas county. The expense of conveyance was \$53.86.

The work of manufacturing brick at the penitentiary will begin as soon as the weather settles, as it is necessary to furnish about 500,000 for the new wing to be added to the asylum. About 1,000,000 will probably be made this season.

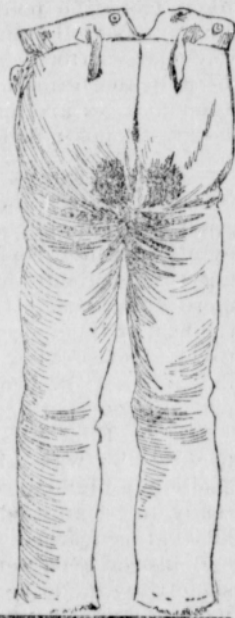

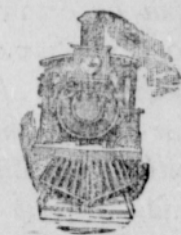
