There is one thing that the News editor wishes to call the attention of the new city officials to and that is the drain from the Gold Hill Hotel. It is very dangerous to the good health of the community and should have the immediate attention of the city officials. As might be expected, the foreign cotton is imported for special purposes. The Egyptian product is used in making balbriggan hosiery and sewing thread. It has a long, fine, silky staple, and in this respect is superior to the upland cotton of the United States. The so-called Sea Island cotton, grown along the coast of South Carolina and Georgia, is better than the Egyptian article, but it is too costly. In quality and price the Egyptian cotton comes between the upland and Sea Island cotton.

The cotton brought here from Peru has a coarse, crinkly, woolly

fiber and is not used in the production of cotton goods at all. It is sold to the woollen manufacturers to be mixed with wool. The Peruvian cotton is often called "vegetable wool" on this account. Its resemblance to real wool is so close that only a chemical test will distinguish between them.—Ex.

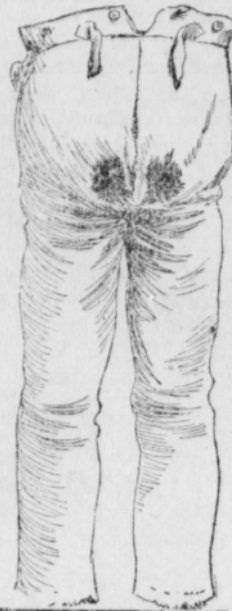
