**WANDERED OFF AND PERISHED.**  
**Death of a Boy in the Mountains Near Ashland.**  
 ASHLAND, Or., May 8.—Willie Hogue, the 16-year-old son of P. N. Hogue, a rancher, residing on Wagner creek, west of Ashland, disappeared from his home, which is in the foothills, and wandered off into the mountains last Thursday evening. Search was instituted for him at once and kept up continuously, the number engaged yesterday being about 150 people, but without success, until this afternoon, when the lad's body was found a half-day's journey from the scene of disappearance, on the Applegate. The appearance of the body indicated that life had been extinct for two or three days. The boy had always been weak-minded. It is supposed that he became bewildered and wandering about, soon succumbed to hunger and exposure.
