### UPHOLDS WIFE-BEATING.

**A St. Louis Judge Who Thinks It's a Good Thing Now and Then.**  
Thomas H. Peabody of St. Louis, Mo., who has gained national notoriety by advocating a little wife beating now and then, has presided as judge of the first district police court for four years. Judge Peabody prides himself upon being a "thorough American," and he never sits in court without a big American

flag behind him. Since he has been holding court he has made many enemies among the quasi-lawyers who practice under him. One of them has even gone so far as to go out gunning for the judge, and at one time only the interference of the marshals kept the court room from becoming a scene of tragedy.

The wife had desired to send her children to Sunday school the preceding Sunday, while Kretzer interfered with this program by insisting that one of them should run an errand. As a result of this difference of opinion Kretzer slapped his wife and the latter had the pater-familias hauled into court. The judge held that the mother's interference with the father's will in family matters furnished a "bad example" and justified the husband in correcting her. The learned Solomon then delivered a lecture on the subject wherein he upheld the right of the husband to punish his wife.

### THE PRINCESS SALM-SALM.

**An Amiable Woman, Whose Husband Fought for the Union.**

The visit of the Princess Salm-Salm, Bonn, Germany, to this country will bring up pictures of the past to the minds of those familiar with the incidents of the civil war. The princess,

formerly Agnes McClernq, an American girl, is the widow of Prince Felix Constantine Alexander Prince Nipomucene Salm-Salm of Anhalt, who came to this country and fought on the Union side during the war. He became a brigadier general and his wife, for her services in behalf of the Union soldiers, was commissioned a captain by Gov. Yates of Illinois. She received the pay of the rank, but gave it for the relief of sick and wounded soldiers. Her husband subsequently went to Mexico and became chief of staff to Maximilian. He lost his life in the Franco-Prussian war. For efforts to save the life of Maximilian the princess was granted a pension by the Austrian Emperor. The princess is slender, of medium height, and her hair is more auburn than gray. She has a bright, pleasant face, with sparkling eyes.

The princess, who is in this country visiting, brought with her three flags of the old Sixty-eighth New York volunteers, which were presented to her husband, and which will be given to the veterans of the Sixty-eighth. She has also three flags which belonged to the Eighth New York volunteers, of which her husband was for a time colonel. These she will return to the Eighth regiment.

#### Capron's Farewell to His Son.

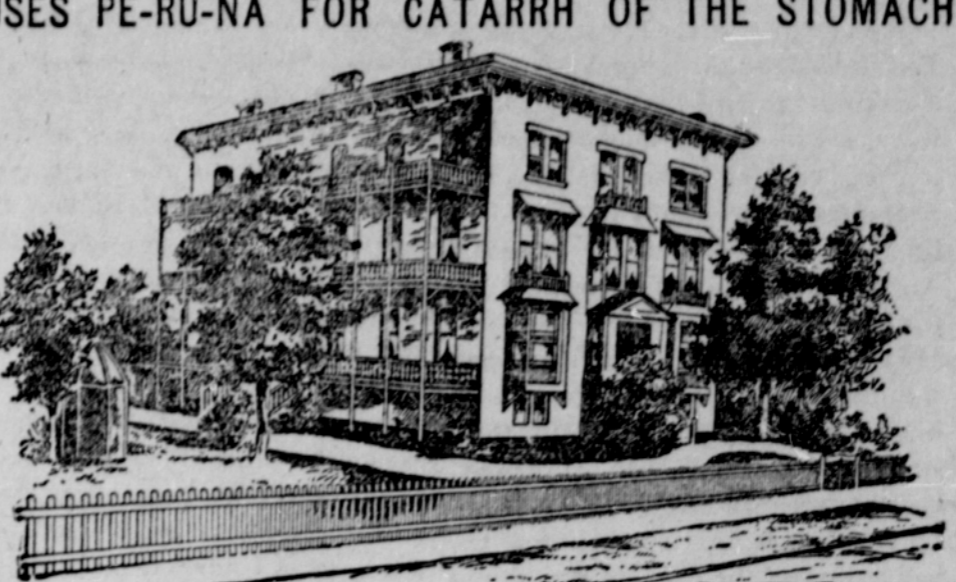
