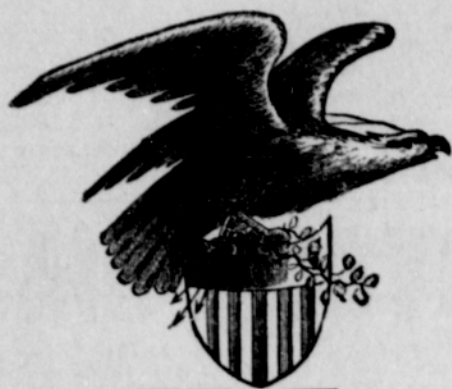

Distinct evidence of local prosperity is furnished in the decrease to the amount of \$15,027 in the mortgage indebtedness of Lane county since the beginning of the year. The entire amount released in that time was \$119,677, while mortgages representing \$104,640 were filed, showing a decrease as above. The statement is more satisfactory in that the showing is made during the months of the year in which there is small surplus in farm products, and from the further fact that interest charges have decreased from 8 and 10 per cent to 6 and 8 per cent. evidences of returning prosperity and its influence upon the money market cannot by any stretch of a Bryanized imagination, be distorted into free-silver campaign material. The only hope of political malcontents is to ignore record evidence of this character and stick to the bald assumption that the country is going to wreck and ruin under the gold standard.—Oregonian.

The most expensive hat on record cost \$1500 in gold, and was presented to General Grant while in Mexico, in 1882. It is now on exhibition in the national museum in Washington—perhaps the finest Mexican sombrero that was ever made. While William H. Seward was secretary of state in Lincoln's cabinet some of his admirers in South America sent him a Panama hat which cost \$1000. It was on exhibition in a show window in New York for a year or more. Panama hats used to be frequently sold as high as \$500 each. A New York hatter says that in 1867 he sold three hats at that price in a single day, but they are no longer on the market. The most expensive hat he has sold for several years was bought by a New York banker last summer for \$110. It was the last fine Panama hat in stock. Such hats are still worn by the hidalgos in South America. They are not made in Panama, but got the name because that city was formerly the greatest market for them. The finest hats come from Guayaquil and Payta, Peru. They are made of the fiber of the pita, or pineapple plant, which is as soft and pliable as silk, and some of them are so fine that they can be folded up and carried in the vest pocket.
